## Maths (Please see the video link in the email sent from the school office if you need help!) Aim: To add two amounts of money, beginning to cross into £s

You can still use the **Coin counting/ sorting** games on Active Learn to practise recognising and adding coins. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/money/coins-game

Today, I would like you to complete **page 62 and 63** in your Abacus books. As we have been practising, start with the largest number and count on. **The picture on page 62 only shows the coins that you need to add on**. You can do it the same way I showed you yesterday by using the 1-100 square, or by using column addition. On page 63, be careful as the totals might be more than £1, so make sure you record them properly. You can use the 101-200 square to help if you need to.

Remember that 100p = £1, so 121p is the same as £1.21


