

Make a paper Handprint Bunny

Instructions

- Trace a handprint. BUT make the handprint slightly fatter than you normally would. (Don't trace tightly around the fingers or the ears and arms will look really skinny).
- 2. Cut out the handprint. Make sure you have a V at the bottom between each finger (rather than a curve).
- 3. Cut a small slit beside the baby finger. The bottom of the cut should line up with the bottom of the space beside the thumb.
- 4. Fold down the baby finger and thumb towards the center to make the bunny arms.
- 5. Cut off the middle finger so you're left with two finger "bunny ears".
- 6. Use a pink marker, pen or pencil crayon to draw the pink parts of the ears. Then draw an oval for the rabbit's nose.



- 8. Finally draw two little paws at the bottom of the handprint to make the bunny's feet.
- 9. Your paper bunny is complete!
