

Aim: To subtract by using the counting up method

I know what you are thinking... FROG AGAIN? This is your last chance to practise subtracting by counting up with our little amphibian friend. Tomorrow you will have a different aim.

THINK optional

Draw a frog line. The end number is 185. Frog did a jump of 35 so subtract 35. Your answer should be a multiple of 10 (?). What number might have frog started on (?). It would be before ? and not a multiple of 10. There are many possible answers.



Literacy

Aim: To draft a Non-Fiction report

Using the plan that you wrote yesterday, start drafting your ideas into sentences and write short paragraphs. When we get back to school, we will use this draft to extend your ideas and write longer paragraphs. Remember to write facts first, then add your opinion about these facts. For example: In Alaska, people use snowmobiles to travel in the winter. (FACT) I would find it very exciting to go to my friend's house on a snowmobile. (OPINION)

Look at the provided Report Writing Checklist. Your job today is the do steps 5 to 8 and start drafting your text. Read my example to get ideas.

The **title** can have an alliteration like in the eBook (**S**plendid **S**pain) or you can create your own idea as long as it's clear which country you chose or what your report is going to be about (for example, My Future Location)

The **introduction** must give the answer to the Big Question: Where would you like to live?

Each **paragraph** will explain why you chose that country. You can use the same headings as the eBook: At Home, At School, At Play, or you can think of your own 3 reasons why you chose that country and make up your own headings such as Lifestyle, Traditions, Food, Animals, Geography, etc. In your plan, think of 2 ideas per paragraph.

The **conclusion** can say whether you really would like to live there one day when you are older for work, or move there with your family now, or just visit for a holiday.

Remember to use the topic-related words which you have thought of in your plan yesterday such as currency, capital city, language, population.







Conclusion




