
### Example:



- 1. **PHONICS**. Complete the 6<sup>th</sup> sheet in your Phonics pack. (You each have a different pack according to your Phonics groups Miss Lauren, Miss Jasmine and Miss Gwenno's groups) There is a photocopy of the page from the Floppy Phonics book to help you with the sound. Remember to:
- put the date on top
- read the words by sounding out and blending them together
- choose different colours, then colour the sounds in the words
- use your sound buttons under the words
- try to make some sentences with the words on the back of the sheet. If you have any questions, please send me an email.

2. **LITERACY**. Today we are going to learn about suffixes. We have done some work about suffixes in class. A suffix is a group of letters that go at the end of a word to change it slightly.

On Active Learn, I have uploaded a new game **Word endings** all about investigating how the suffixes '-ing', '-ed', '-er' and '-est' can be added to some words without changing the spelling. Please click on the video first before thinking with ending you need for the word. I have also attached some screens for you to read and some worksheets for you to complete.


Make sure to leave the first flag clicked as we are learning about United Kingdom's coins.
