Phonics/ Spellings

Please complete your phonics sheets from yesterday if you didn't finish them. Take your time to read your sentences to check for the correct spellings just like we do in lessons.

Hopefully, you have been practising your spellings from your spelling lists. Today would usually be your spelling test, so please ask an adult to test you on your words. If you need to practise any of them again, you can do this by putting them in sentences and writing them in your handwriting book.

<u>Maths</u>

Aim: To Interpret and complete a pictogram or a block graph where one block or symbol represents one item

Keep practising telling the time with o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past times- the clock tool is still there for you to use.

Today I would like you to practise making a pictogram. A pictogram is a way to show information using pictures.

You will need Resource sheet 615a (on Active Learn)

You need to collect a pile of at least 12 books from around your house (if you don't have 12 books, you could just use your imagination and make it up).

Sort the books into the categories of what they are about- animals, people, fairy tales, fantasy, space or other.

Count how many there are in each group. If there is 1 book about animals, draw one picture of a book in the square above where it says 'animals'. Use the key on the sheet to help you.

Continue to do this for the other categories until you have finished. If there are 3 books about Space then you should draw 3 pictures of books. If you can't print a copy of the sheet, you could draw your own pictogram on paper.

Challenge: Can you write 3 questions to ask someone about your pictogram?

E.g. How many books were there about animals?

What was the least popular type of book (smallest number)? How many more books were there about animals than space?

<u>Challenge of the day: do a jigsaw puzzle or</u> play a board game with your family if you have time

<u>Science</u>

Look at the pictures and decide which parts of the fruit and vegetables we eat. If you can't print the sheet or pictures, you can copy the 6 boxes onto paper and draw your own pictures inside them with labels. Remember to colour in the pictures too if you can. You can add some of your own ideas if you like.


Plants That We Eat

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Literacy Aim: to understand how to use adverbs


