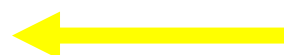

The £ sign goes FIRST



E.g. A cake costs £2.15, so use



$$£2 + 10p + 5p = £2.15$$

. goes AFTER the whole pounds

How would you pay for the other items? Record your answers for the other items by drawing the notes and coins and writing a number sentence like mine.

Investigation

Now try this:

You have 3 groups of coins, **gold**, **silver** (not 5p) and **brown/ copper**.

**Each time, you can choose only 1 coin from each box to make an amount.** Write down your answers in number sentences. How many different amounts can you make?

Gold	Silver	Brown/Copper

Tip: there are 12 different ways.

**Literacy** Aim: to use words containing the suffixes –ment and –ness

We use these to turn words into nouns. E.g. enjoy- enjoyment, happy- happiness.

**Be careful because the rule applies that when the word ends in a consonant and ‘y’, that you must change it to ‘i’.**

## Suffixes -ment, -ful, -less, -ness and ly

A suffix is an 'ending' used at the end of a root word to turn it into another word. Sometimes, the root word has to be changed before a suffix is added.

Adding -ment can change a verb into a noun.

Adding -ful or -less can change verbs or nouns into adjectives.

Adding -ness can change an adjective into a noun.

Adding -ly can change an adjective into an adverb.

## Science

Today, I'd like you to read about the life cycle of bean plant. See if you can answer the questions by using the information in the text.

# The Life Cycle of a Bean Plant

Beans are a type of plant.

The bean plant goes through six stages in a life cycle.

1



### The Seed Germinates

The plant starts life as a seed. The seed begins to germinate, or grow. A shoot emerges in about two to three days.

2



### The Plant Grows

The seedling continues to grow, and a stem and leaves appear. Roots continue to grow underground.

3



### The Plant Flowers

The plant produces flowers. Bean plant flower petals can be red, white, or yellow. You can usually see flowers after six to eight weeks.

4



### The Flower Produces Fruit

The bean plant produces pods of beans after 12 to 14 weeks. These pods are what we can pick and eat.

5



### The Fruit Releases Seeds

The flower shrivels, and seeds fall onto the ground.

### The Plant Dies

The final stage is when the plant dies. The seeds that are left produce new plants.
