### **Mathematics**

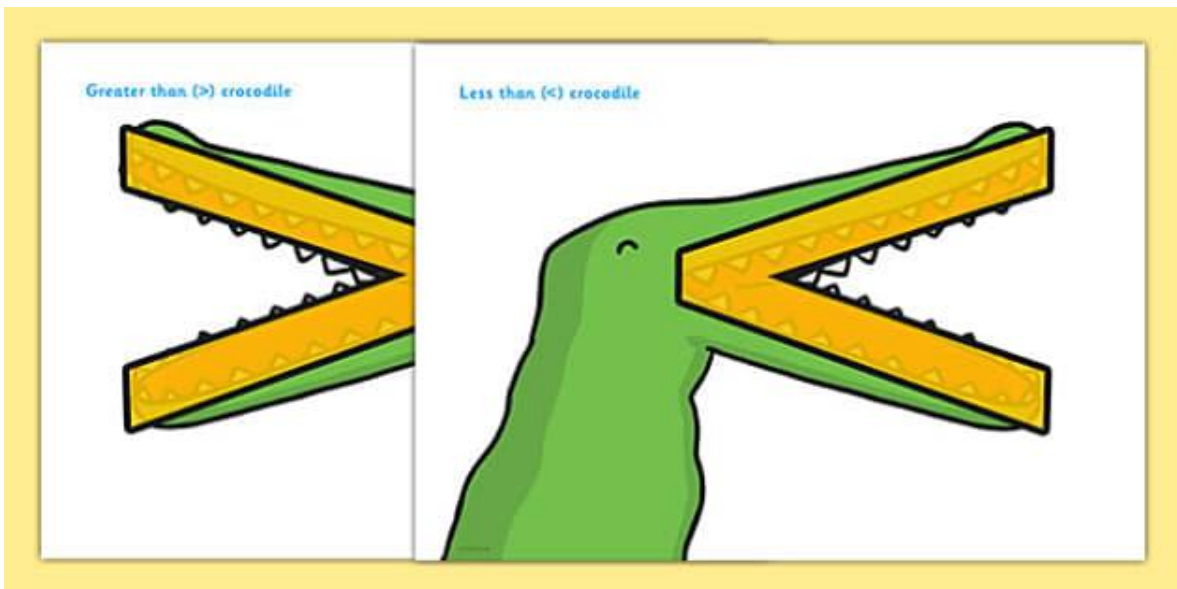
P.74 and P.75

Aim: To compare and order 3-digit numbers

For the children who were in school on Friday, please do this in your orange squared notebooks. Set out your work the way we always do, with the short date, aim and page numbers.

p.74 numbers 1-6 : Comparing two numbers

Remember the crocodile wants to eat the largest number so open his mouth towards the biggest number.



Example:

$6 \geq 4$  (6 is larger than 4)     $3 \leq 9$  (3 is less than 9)

p.74 numbers 7 – 12 and p.75 numbers 1 - 8

Order the numbers from SMALLEST to LARGEST. You can use the symbol 'less than' between each number.

Example:

$134 \leq 256 \leq 459$

p. 75 number 9

For each number sentence written before, add a number **in between**.

For example, on number one you wrote

$116 \leq 148 \leq 152$

Now write

$116 \leq \mathbf{132} \leq 148 \leq \mathbf{150} \leq 152$

THINK is optional

Count how many numbers come in between the numbers given.

Example:

Between 235 and 245, there are 9 whole numbers (236, 237, 238, 239, 240, 241, 242, 243, 244)

Can you find two numbers that have 19 whole numbers in between? There are lots of possible answers to this.

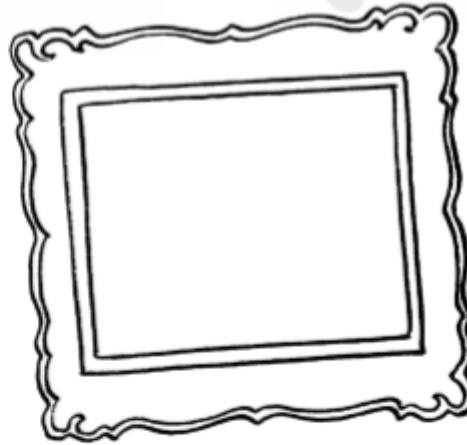
