Phonics/ Literacy

I know how much my group love crosswords, so using your phonics words from this week, why not have a go at making your own crossword on line.

The link to the site is on ActiveLearn-'Easy crossword maker'.

Open the web link.

Click on the play button and then the orange arrow.

STEP 1 Name your crossword- E.g. long yoo and oo sounds and then press the orange arrow above.

STEP 2 Choose 'TYPE' and press the orange arrow again.

Start by choosing 10 or more words from your phonics book/ work this week. Try to think of a clue that will help someone to guess your word.

STEP 3 Type each one and its clue and press the blue arrow to go to the next word until you have done at least 10 (more is better so that it can fit them together).

STEP 4 Press **DONE** when you have finished your last word.

Check your words and clues.

STEP 5 Select **ONLINE** to do the puzzle online or PRINT to print and then the orange arrow!

If you can't do this, please practise your phonics words in your handwriting book. Remember to use a sharp pencil and try to use your best handwriting.

Reading

When you log onto Activelearn today, you will see a new icon (Bug Club). We now have access to some online books for you to read at home too. Read the books and click on the Bug pictures to answer questions about the book.


Maths

Aim: To Interpret and complete a pictogram or a block graph where one block or symbol represents two items

Keep practising telling the time with o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past times- the clock tool is still there for you to use.

Today you will be working with pictograms again, but now **each picture stands for 2 items/ votes** instead of 1.

If you would like a challenge or you don't have your Abacus book, you can use **Resource sheets 616** (Pictogram- wild animals) and 617 (Favourite wild animals) (on ActiveLearn- click on my stuff, Abacus, scroll right to the end) to help you draw your own pictogram. If you can't print, use the numbers from sheet 617 (above) and draw the pictogram with a ruler on your own paper. Try to remember to give your pictogram a title and label the axes.

<u>Top tip:</u> Try to choose a SIMPLE symbol such as a square or a circle that you can easily draw and cut in half!

Science

If you have noticed any changes in your bean plant, please complete your **Bean Diary** for today. Some of them may now have a shoot and a long root, with shorter roots coming from it, and possibly a stem starting to grow so they have become seedlings. Others might be a bit further behind! If your bean has not grown and you haven't planted your spare bean, you should definitely do that now! If there is no change, use this time to try some sketches of flowers or plants in the back of your Bean diary.
